#### **OUR TOP INDUSTRIES**



#### orestry

Alberta-Pacific Forest Industries Inc. (Al-Pac) is Canada's newest and North-America's largest, single-line bleached kraft pulp mill. It is located 30 minutes north of Boyle and 35 minutes northeast of Athabasca. Those looking to leverage local workforce talent and northern Alberta's wood fiber resource can develop a niche, small scale, and high value output operation. This could range from a hobby craft to an industrial production.



#### Oil & Gas

The Athabasca Region is a service hub for the Athabasca Oil Sands, the Peace River Oil Sands, and the Cold Lake Oil Sands. Natural gas infrastructure is also in the region. Investment opportunities include highway commercial enterprises, oilfield services, freight trucking, management consulting, machinery & equipment repairs, metal fabrication and logistical/ warehousing support enterprises.



### Agriculture

The County has 673 farms and one million acres of land (2021) that produces a wide variety of outputs and has potential to be processed locally in a low-cost business environment. The agricultural land is less than two-hours from the Edmonton CMA consumer and distribution network. Leading product outputs include beef, equine, poultry/eggs, wheat, canola, barley, peas, flax, oats, and specialty crops.



#### **Tourism**

Tourism is a feature of the region's economy, driven by the presence of numerous lakes, rivers, trails, and vast open spaces offering natural beauty without the crowds. Investment opportunities exist for independent entrepreneurs and recreational property owners looking to develop businesses around this sector. The many trails and endless opportunities to adventure into the outdoors makes the Athabasca Region a great place to start a new tourism venture.
