


ABOUT THE TOWN OF ATHABASCA

The Town is within Athabasca County, situated in the geographic center of Alberta with major highways 2, 55, 63 & 813 connecting the region to Edmonton, Fort McMurray, Slave Lake and the Wabasca-Demarais area. With access to the CN railway, the Athabasca Regional Airport, the CANAMEX Corridor, and with fibre optic connection in key areas, Athabasca County is the modern gateway to the north.

Healthcare

There are a range of healthcare services in the Town of Athabasca including a 24/7 emergency department at the Athabasca Healthcare Centre and two medical clinics, the Athabasca Family Health Centre and the Athabasca Medical Centre. Diagnostic imaging services are provided by the Aspen Diagnostic Imaging clinic.

There are several pharmacies and other health-related professional services available in the Town including:

Education



There are four schools in the Aspen View School Division serving the Town including Whispering Hills Primary School (Pre-K-3), Landing Trail Intermediate School (Grades 4-6), Edwin Parr Composite School (Grades 7-12), and the Centre for Alternative and Virtual Education (Grades 7-12). Post Secondary education and training can be achieved through Northern Lakes College and Athabasca University. Additional continuing education programs exist through the Blue Heron Vocational Centre and Words Work Literacy Society.



Housing

The Town of Athabasca provides many choices to accommodate different types of residential properties for owners. These include single family homes, country residential acreages, apartments & condominiums, and manufactured home parks. The cost of living (monthly shelter costs) is roughly 14% below Alberta costs and median house prices were roughly 12% below Alberta prices. For specific age groups, the Town offers

housing in senior care facilities, assisted living facilities, low income housing, and adult living communities. Residential and Commercial real estate listings can be found at www.realtor.ca.



Community Services

In the Town of Athabasca, emergency services include by-law enforcement, fire protection services, and an RCMP Detachment. Call 911 in an emergency and the Call Answer Service will identify your physical location and connect you to Fire, Ambulance or Police Services. STARS has a fuel cache at the Athabasca Regional Airport and provides emergency transport. The Town also has over 50 service clubs and associations that offer volunteer opportunities and services to improve the well-being of the residents.



Recreation

The Town of Athabasca is uniquely situated on on the banks of the mighty Athabasca River. The area's untouched forests, pristine lakes, and other natural features are an outdoor enthusiasts' delight. From parks, arts and cultural activities and festivals to golf courses and fitness facilities, Athabasca has something for everyone. The Athabasca Regional Multiplex offers walking, running, hockey, figure skating, soccer, swimming, basketball, badminton, tennis, lacrosse, dance, gymnastics and more. The Multiplex is also available for conferences, weddings, trade shows, graduations, parties, and meetings of all sorts. Situated within the Town limits, the Muskeg Creek Trails are a hidden gem covering an area of 17.5 square kilometers. Also connecting to local schools, Athabasca University, and the Rotary Trail system that stretches across town, the Muskeg Creek Trails area a must see.
