


The County of Minburn

CONNECTED TO GLOBAL MARKETS



The County of Minburn has approximately 500,000 acres of crop land with Wheat, Canola, Dry Field Peas, Barley and Oats the major commodities being grown. The climate of the County offers excellent conditions for growing Industrial Hemp, Faba beans and Quinoa.

The urban centers of Vegreville, Mannville and Innisfree support the Agriculture sector with farm machinery agents, business support services and research facilities.

The County of Minburn has an excellent transportation network connecting to global markets for agriculture products. Hwy 16 is an east /west corridor connecting to western seaports and Asian markets.

Highway 36 is the high load corridor defined as the Eastern Alberta Trade Corridor, connecting to U.S. and Mexican markets.

The CN rail line runs east-west through the County. Running parallel to Hwy 16 it offers advantages to prospective developers. Sidings, spur trackage and point loading areas are available.

Viterra Inc. has a new high throughput grain terminal near Vegreville. This facility has a storage capacity of 34,000 metric tonnes, with the ability to load up to 126 railcars through a loop track that will be serviced by CN Rail. GrainsConnect Canada's high-speed train loading terminal near Vegreville offers 35,000 tonnes of storage, with a loop capable of loading 134 rail cars in under 14 hours.



Vegreville is home to the only decortication plant in Alberta at Innotech Alberta. It is North America's largest such R&D Facility.

Innotech Alberta in Vegreville conducts research and demonstrations that provide valuable information to producers and processing companies. Research has been conducted on Industrial Hemp, Flax, Canola and Faba Beans.
