


Two Hills County

CONNECTED TO GLOBAL MARKETS



Highway 36 is the high load corridor defined as the Eastern Alberta Trade Corridor, connecting to U.S. and Mexican markets.

Agriculture is a major economic sector in Two Hills County. The Gross Farm Receipts grew 32% since 2016 hitting close to \$183 million in 2021. The County has some of the best soil and climatic conditions for numerous crops including industrial hemp, quinoa, canola, wheat, oats, barely, rye, flax crops and field peas. The County offers many investment opportunities in value-added agriculture.

The County of Two Hills has a strong agricultural service sector in the Town of Two Hills and the Village of Myrnam.

Seed Cleaning Plants located in Willingdon and Myrnam provide numerous services for producers.

Livestock is also a vital part of the sector; the County is home to a specialized custom feedlot enterprise called Highland Feeders Ltd., which operates a 36,000-head finishing lot.

Just 135 km northeast of Edmonton and the International Airport, the County has three important highway routes: Hwy 45, an east/west corridor; and Hwy 36 and 41, two of Alberta's High Load Corridors that connect to U.S. markets. The Two Hills Airport provides a non-commercial airport service with a 2,900 ft. lit runway. CN Rail access is available approx. 20 minutes south on Highway 36.

The County has experienced a 27% increase in the Value of Livestock & Poultry in five years, with close to 48,000 pigs and 65,000 head of cattle.
