Eastern Alberta Trade Corridor (EATC).... Local to Global Forum

Over 70 municipal elected officials, GOA Ministers, MLAs, Economic Development Officers representing Communities in eastern rural Alberta gathered to promote regional economic development.

The Northeast Alberta Information HUB (Alberta HUB), Battle River Alliance Economic Development (BRAED) and Palliser Economic Partnership (PEP) through the EATC initiative held its Local to Global forum April 23rd through 25th in Medicine Hat.

This annual forum brings together key stakeholders through-out the eastern side of Alberta to plan and promote a North/South economic corridor from the U.S. border to Northeastern Alberta. Through the Wild Horse port of entry via highway 41 and 36 this becomes a major component of the Ports to Plains Corridor of the United States, connecting Canada and Mexico. The EATC provides an alternate route to the CANAMEX corridor allowing for increased investment and the creation jobs in rural Alberta.

We were very honoured that Minister Sigurdson, Agriculture & Irrigation, and Minister Neudorf, Affordability & Utilities attended and spoke to the strength of our Agriculture sector and the electricity capacity of our province.
